Attached you will find an ordinance appropriating the following:

\$1,200,000 in the General Fund

This will be a transfer out from General Fund to Parks Cumulative Capital Fund for the engineering for Franke Park. Parks will have their ordinance discussed the same night as the appropriations discussion.

\$575,000 in the American Rescue Plan Fiscal Recovery Fund

Per the current State Board of Accounts Directive 2021-1, the ARPA funds must be appropriated by the fiscal body.

- Super Shot has requested funding of \$375,000 from the City and County to ensure clinics can provide needed vaccinations and shots to communities in need.
- The \$125,000 will be to work with a consultant on the ARPA planning and reporting for 2021. The consultant has experience in these funds as well as those becoming available. Our hope is to leverage our \$50.8 million with other communities and other funding opportunities to provide as much services to our communities.
- The other \$75,000 will be to hire personnel to focus on planning, disbursing and maintaining records in compliance with the US Treasury guidelines.

\$3,000,000 in the LIT-Economic Development Fund (previously known as CEDIT)

\$3,000,000 in the LIT-Non-Reverting Fund (Sidewalks, Alleys and Riverfront)

These funds are being appropriated to Public Works to continue the projects that were delayed in 2020 due to the unknown effects of COVID 19 on income tax revenues. We feel we have better information and are comfortable in re-appropriating these dollars.
