11 and chip and seal anticipated projects, known at the time of budget printing, for
12 the following year. For the four (4) following years, the Public Works Division shall
13 identify several neighborhood projects from each councilmanic district that should,
14 barring material, budgetary, or unforeseen issues, have work initiated within the
15 four (4) year time period. This will include concrete, asphalt, and chip and seal
16 projects.



18 (B) Any Annual Budget and corresponding annual budget appropriation ordinance
19 submitted by the Mayor as required by law shall include the Transportation
20 System Capital Improvement Plan as required in section A of this chapter.

22 (C) Council is prohibited from approving any proposed Budget that does not include
23 the Transportation System Capital Improvement Plan as required in section A of
24 this chapter.
