2 **GENERAL ORDINANCE NO. G-14-25**

3 **AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 51 OF**
4 **THE CITY OF FORT WAYNE CODE OF ORDINANCES**

5 **WHEREAS**, pursuant to Indiana Code 36-9-23-25, the Common Council of the City of Fort
6 Wayne Indiana has enacted a User Charge System and a Sewer Use Ordinance as contained in Chapter 51
7 of the Fort Wayne Code of Ordinances; and

8 **WHEREAS**, Indiana Code 8-1.5-3-8 states that rates and charges of municipally owned utilities
9 are unlawful if they are too low to produce income sufficient to maintain the utility property in a sound
10 physical and financial condition to render adequate and efficient services; and

11 **WHEREAS**, the City of Fort Wayne is subject to a Consent Decree, effective April 1, 2008,
12 wherein the City must construct certain facilities at certain times within 18 years from the effective date to
13 achieve certain specified levels of control over combined sewer overflows. Further, the City must avoid
14 sanitary sewer overflows and must report timely on progress and events or pay per diem fines and penalties
15 for failure to meet deadlines, milestones or for failure to provide sufficient maintenance; and

16 **WHEREAS**, the Water Pollution Control Utility has continued to develop and implement plans
17 for investments in high value combined sewer system projects, projects to build capacity in the sanitary
18 sewer interceptors for future economic growth and development, a continuation of pipeline rehabilitation
19 work, and preventative maintenance programs for maintenance sufficiency; and

20 **WHEREAS**, various sewer capacity and water quality capital projects have been incorporated
21 into a long-term plan for sewer improvements for the next five (5) years (2025 – 2029), which are included
22 in the sewage works Capital Improvement Program (“CIP”); and

23 **WHEREAS**, upon review of the sewage works CIP, the Board of Works of the City of Fort
24 Wayne found that existing rates and charges for the use of and services rendered by the Water Pollution
25 Control Utility do not provide sufficient revenue to:

26 (a) Pay all expenses incidental to the operation of the sewage works as defined in 36-9-1-8,
27 including legal expenses, maintenance costs, operating charges, repairs, lease rentals, and interest charges
28 on bonds or other obligations;

29 (b) Provide the sinking fund required by Indiana Code 36-9-23-21 for proposed debt; and

30 (c) Provide adequate money for improving and replacing the sewage works, including
projects that are required by the Consent Decree; and

WHEREAS, a series of adjustments in treatment, conveyance and other rates and fees rates
shown herein, is needed to fund the sewer CIP projects for the next five (5) years (2025 – 2029) and meet
the requirements of Indiana Code 36-9-23-25; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Public Works of the City of Fort Wayne did resolve that it is in the best
interest of the Fort Wayne Water Pollution Control Utility, in order to provide income sufficient to
maintain the utility property in a sound physical and financial condition to be able to render adequate and
efficient service to its users while implementing the recommendations of the Utility Advisory Group,
requirements of the Consent Decree, and the Utility’s approved five-year CIP, to revise sewage rates

1 charged to all sewage works users as shown herein for the years listed, and did recommended that such
2 changes be adopted by Common Council by way of an amendment to Chapter 51 of the Fort Wayne Code
3 of Ordinances; and

4 **WHEREAS**, the Common Council now finds the sewer rates for the next five (5) years are
5 insufficient pursuant to Indiana Code 36-9-23-25 to meet the needs of the Fort Wayne Water Pollution
6 Control Utility (sewage works), including capital projects planned for the next five (5) years; and

7 **WHEREAS**, the Common Council of the City of Fort Wayne now finds it is in the best interest of
8 the Fort Wayne Water Pollution Control Utility, in order to provide income sufficient to maintain the utility
9 property in a sound physical and financial condition to be able to render adequate and efficient service to
10 its users while implementing the recommendations of the Sewer Advisory Group and requirements of the
11 Consent Decree, and the Utility's five-year CIP to revise sewage rates charged to all sewage works users as
12 shown herein for the years listed, effective as of the following dates: the initial adjustment for the year
13 2025 shall take effect no earlier than thirty (30) days after adoption of this Ordinance and any necessary
14 approval by the Mayor; subsequent adjustments shall take effect on January 1 of each successive year
15 through 2029.

16 **NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY
17 OF FORT WAYNE, INDIANA;**

18 **SECTION 1.** That the definition of the term "Area Connection Fee" contained in Section 51.001
19 of the Fort Wayne Code of Ordinances is hereby deleted in its entirety and replaced with the following
20 (with all other definitions in Section 51.001 remaining unchanged):

21 **AREA CONNECTION FEE.** An additional one-time fee charged per ERU at the time of or prior to
22 connection to the sewer utility or request for capacity increase for any classification of users discharging
23 sewage to the water pollution control utility from a geographic area designated responsible to contribute to
24 the payment of costs associated with installation, adjustment or other

25 **SECTION 2.** Section 51.066 of the Fort Wayne Code of Ordinances is hereby deleted in its
26 entirety and replaced with the following:

27 **§ 51.066 WATER OBTAINED FROM SOURCES OTHER THAN CITY'S WATER UTILITY.**

28 (A) Where the property obtains any part or all of the water used from sources other than the
29 city's water utility, the owner or the tenant may be required by the city to install and maintain at the user's
30 own expense a meter or meters acceptable to the city for the quantity of water obtained from these other
sources. Once installed, no such meter may be bypassed for any reason.

(B) *Residential meter on well.* The following provisions apply only to single family
residential dwellings:

(1) If a single family residential dwelling obtains all or part of its water from a well,
the owner of the property on which the dwelling is located may request the city to install a meter

on the well for purposes of calculating the monthly sewage fees. The city may approve installation of a meter on the well if the following conditions are met:

- (a) The property can be served by a 5/8" x 3/4", 3/4", or 1" water meter;
- (b) The property is served by a single lateral; and
- (c) The owner of the property pays the cost of installation of the meter and

(2) Upon installation of a water meter on the well, the fees for sewage service shall be based on the volume of water passing through the water meter as set forth in Section 51.065. The customer shall be responsible for all consumption and service charges set forth in Section 51.069, as well as any applicable capital surcharges as set forth in Section 51.075.

SECTION 3. Section 51.066.5 of the Fort Wayne Code of Ordinances is hereby deleted in its entirety and replaced with the following:

§ 51.066.5 DISCHARGES OF NON-POTABLE WATER TO SANITARY SEWER SYSTEM.

(A) *Definition of non-potable water.* As used in this section, **NON-POTABLE WATER** means any form of water that is not immediately fit for human consumption. The term includes, without limitation, stormwater, surface runoff, industrial process water, landfill water, and all other forms of untreated water.

(B) *Application of section.* This section does not apply to discharges from downspouts, yard drains, sump pumps, or geothermal systems. Discharges from those sources are governed by § 51.074 and rules and regulations promulgated by the Fort Wayne Water Pollution Control Utility and the Fort Wayne Stormwater Utility.

(C) *Meter required for discharges of non-potable water to sanitary sewer.* The following provisions apply to all non-potable water discharges to a sanitary sewer:

(1) If a property owner discharges non-potable water to the city's sanitary sewer system, the owner of the property from which the discharge occurs must install a meter on the discharge line for purposes of calculating the monthly sewage fees. Each discharge line shall serve only one property.

(2) The property owner shall be responsible for the cost of the meter and radio, as well as the installation of the meter and radio. Meter and radio costs are as follows:

(3) Upon installation of a non-potable water meter, the fees for sewage service shall be based on the volume of water passing through the water meter as set forth in § 51.065. The customer shall be responsible for all consumption and service charges set forth in § 51.069, as well as any applicable capital surcharges as set forth in § 51.075.

(D) *Temporary non-potable water.* Any person who seeks to discharge non-potable water to the city's sanitary sewer system on a temporary basis (e.g., for a period not to exceed 180 days or such other period as is approved by the city) must request a temporary non-potable meter and obtain approval from City Utilities to discharge the non-potable water into the sanitary sewer. City Utilities shall be authorized to charge an administrative fee for temporary non-potable water discharges as well as consumption charges based on the volume of water discharged to the sanitary sewer at the rates set forth in § 51.069.

SECTION 4. Section 51.067 of the Fort Wayne Code of Ordinances is hereby deleted in its entirety and replaced with the following:

§ 51.067 EXEMPT WATER – GENERAL.

(A) Where a significant portion of the metered water used in commercial, manufacturing, or industrial processes does not and cannot enter the sewerage system, either directly or indirectly, the person having charge of the property may request permission from the utility to install, at the user's expense, a meter or meters to determine the quantity of water that cannot enter the sewerage system or an approved sewage measuring device or devices to determine the volume of sewage that actually enters the sewerage system. If the utility approves the request, the following provisions shall apply:

(1) The customer shall purchase the meter(s) directly from the utility or seek the utility's pre-approval to use alternative meter(s). The customer shall use the utility's radio which must be installed by the utility. Below are the costs for the utility's meters and radios. The costs include the meter and installation of radio only. The meter charge and monthly meter fee shall commence upon receiving the meter.

(2) The meter shall be installed by the customer or its agent in accordance with the utility's installation specifications, and plans for installation (including location of where the meter(s) will be installed) shall be submitted to the utility and approved prior to installation. The customer shall pay a monthly fee per meter/radio, as follows:

The monthly fee amount may be adjusted by the utility on an annual basis to reflect increases in the Consumer Price Index for All Urban Consumers, U.S. City Average, for all items, 1982-84=100 (CPI-U).

(B) In the absence of verifiable data from an approved meter confirming the amount of water that passed through the water meter but did not enter the sewer system, all water passing through the master water meter will be presumed to have entered the sewer system for billing purposes. A customer that engages in water submetering shall not be entitled to have sewage billings based on the sum of water passing through all of the separate water meters.

SECTION 5. Section 51.069 of the Fort Wayne Code of Ordinances is hereby deleted in its entirety and replaced with the following:

§ 51.069 METERED RETAIL USER CHARGES.

(A) Metered retail users include residential, industrial, commercial, institutional and governmental users.

(B) Hereinafter, the terms “inside city” or “outside city” shall be read to distinguish the users located within or outside the corporate boundaries of the City of Fort Wayne. Users designated as outside city who are within an annexation area shall, upon the effective date of annexation, be designated as inside the city and inside city rates and charges shall apply.

(C) Outside city charges for metered consumption, service charges, and for flat user charges (Section 51.070) are 25% more than the charges for inside city users.

(D) *Inside city consumption and service charges.*

(1) *Consumption charge.* Monthly charges for services rendered to users within the corporate boundaries of the City of Fort Wayne shall be based on metered water consumption, unless otherwise measured, in accordance with the following charges for this classification of service:

(E) *Outside city consumption and service charges.*

- (1) Biochemical oxygen demand of 300 milligrams per liter (“mg/l”).
- (2) Chemical oxygen demand of 600 mg/l.
- (3) Suspended solids content of 300 mg/l.
- (4) Phosphorus content of 10 mg/l.
- (5) Ammonia content of 25 mg/l.

(B) *Strength of waste surcharge inside and outside City.* In the event any user contributes waste having strength of sewage in excess of the concentrations set forth in subsection (A), a surcharge based on the following unit process charges will be in effect for all waste found to be in excess of limitations:

(C) The surcharge shall be determined as follows: The excess pounds of BOD or COD (whichever results in the higher charge), suspended solids, phosphorus and ammonia will each be computed by first multiplying the user’s billing sewage volume measured in units of 100 cubic feet for the current billing period by the factor 0.0062321 and then multiplying this product by the difference between, (a) the concentrations measured in milligrams per liter, of the BOD (or COD), suspended solids, phosphorus and ammonia respectively in the user’s sewage, and (b) the allowed concentrations set out in 51.072(A). The surcharge for each constituent will then be determined by multiplying the excess pounds of each constituent by the appropriate rate of surcharge. In the event COD measurement is used, as hereinbefore provided, 50% of the excess pounds measured will be used to compute the equivalent BOD charge.

SECTION 13. Section 51.077 of the Fort Wayne Code of Ordinances is hereby deleted in its entirety and replaced with the following:

§ 51.077 CONTRACT CUSTOMERS.

(A) Contract customer rates are applicable only to those users that meet the criteria described in the definition of a contract customer. If a user does not meet the criteria in the definition of a contract customer, the user will be considered to be a retail customer and retail rates shall apply.

(B) In the event City Utilities consummates a contract to serve as a regional treatment plant to a contract customer the following fees and charges shall apply:

(1) *Treatment charge (per 100 cubic feet).*

(2) *Conveyance charge (per 100 cubic feet).* A variable charge for conveyance and collections costs attributable to each contract customer's portion of the city conveyance system, and operating costs associated therewith, shall be computed by the city and added to the treatment cost to arrive at the contractee's total metered rate.

(3) *Monthly service charge.*

1 (4) *Surveillance/Evaluation charge.* All contract customers discharging wastes into
2 the system that require continuing surveillance sampling and waste evaluation, shall be subject to
3 the charges set forth in 51.071 or as otherwise specified in the customer's contract.

4 (5) *Excess strength of waste.* In the event a contract customer user contributes waste
5 having a strength of sewage in excess of domestic waste characteristics, as hereinbefore defined, a
6 surcharge shall be implemented per 51.072 or as otherwise specified in the customer's contract.

7 (6) *Capital surcharge.* In the event a contract customer delivers sewage for
8 treatment to the city for three consecutive billing periods (approximately 90 consecutive days)
9 which is in excess of the base volume limit guaranteed in the contract, then the customer will be
10 subject to a capital surcharge, computed at the capital rate per 100 cubic feet in effect for outside
11 the city customers set out elsewhere herein. The capital rate per 100 cubic feet shall be multiplied
12 by the excess percentage of volume calculated by dividing the daily average for three billing
13 periods by the contracted volume limit.

14 (7) *Volumetric Exceedance Fee.* The additional fee for exceedances to the
15 contractual volume limits to be collected from contract customer users discharging sewage to the
16 water pollution control utility. This fee (also defined and specified in contracts under different
17 terminology, such as the "Treatment Plant Capital Surcharge") shall be collected as specified in
18 each contract and calculated as defined by the contract. Such fees shall contribute to the payment
19 of costs associated with operation, installation, adjustment or other improvements to the water
20 pollution control utility intended to serve the contract customer when it discharges flows
21 exceeding the capacity allocated per the contract.

22 (8) *Peak Flow Exceedance Fee.* The additional fee for exceedances to the
23 contractual peak flow limits to be collected from contract customer users discharging sewage to
24 the water pollution control utility. This fee (also defined and specified in contracts under
25 different terminology, such as "Peak Penalty Rates") shall be collected as specified in each
26 contract and calculated as defined by the contract. Such fees shall contribute to the payment of
27 costs associated with operation, installation, adjustment or other improvements to the water
28 pollution control utility intended to serve the contract customer when it discharges flows
29 exceeding the capacity allocated per the contract.

30 (9) *Other provisions.* In the event sewage received pursuant to any contract entered
into under this section exceeds any of the limitations imposed by this chapter, City Utilities shall
have the right to impose all limitations, charges and penalties applicable to any non- contract
customer user. Each contract entered into by City Utilities pursuant to the foregoing rate
classification shall provide that the contract customer shall agree to enact and maintain a sewer
use ordinance and user charge system acceptable to City Utilities and in conformance with City
Utilities' obligations under Sec. 204 (b) (1), Public Law 92-500 as amended and supplemented,
and guidelines and regulations promulgated thereunder by the U.S. Environmental Protection
Agency and 40 CFR 35-905-8, 35-928-1 and 35-928-2 and 35-935-13.

(4) Excess strength of waste. In the event a contract customer user contributes waste having a strength of sewage in excess of domestic waste characteristics, as herebefore defined, a surcharge shall be implemented per 51.072 or as otherwise specified in the customer's contract.
(5) Capital surcharge. In the event a contract customer delivers sewage for treatment to the city for three consecutive billing periods (approximately 90 consecutive days) which is in excess of the base volume limit established in the contract, then a capital surcharge shall be subject to a capital surcharge computed at the capital rate per 100 cubic feet in effect for outside the city customers set out elsewhere herein. The capital rate per 100 cubic feet shall be multiplied by the excess percentage of volume calculated by dividing the total volume discharged during the billing period by the contractual volume limit.
(6) Volumetric Excess Charge Fee. The additional fee for excesses above the contractual volume limits to be collected from contract customer users discharging sewage to the water pollution control utility under the contract shall be collected as defined by the contract. Such fees shall continue to the payment of costs associated with operation, installation, adjustment or other improvements to the water pollution control utility incurred to serve the contract customer when it discharges flows exceeding the capacity allocated per the contract.
(7) Peak Flow Excess Charge Fee. The additional fee for excesses to the contractual peak flow limits to be collected from contract customer users discharging sewage to the water pollution control utility. This fee is also defined and specified in contracts under contract terminology, such as "Peak Penalty Rates" shall be collected as specified in each contract and calculated as defined by the contract. Such fees shall contribute to the payment of costs associated with operation, installation, adjustment or other improvements to the water pollution control utility incurred to serve the contract customer when it discharges flows exceeding the capacity allocated per the contract.
(8) Other provisions in the contract sewage received pursuant to any contract entered into under this section exceeds any of the limitations imposed by this chapter. City Utilities shall have the right to impose all limitations, charges and penalties applicable to any non-contract customer user. Each contract entered into by City Utilities pursuant to this section shall provide that the contract customer shall agree to enter into and maintain a sewer use ordinance and user charge system acceptable to City Utilities and in conformance with City Utilities' obligations under Sec. 204 (b) (1), Public Law 95-500 as amended, and supplemental orders, rules, regulations and regulations promulgated thereunder by the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency under 40 CFR 35-905-3, 35-905-1 and 35-905-2 and 35-935.
